Menu

- Appetizers such as Antipasto a platter of salamis, prosciutto, cheeses, olives, marinated artichoke
 hearts, crackers, etc. (two people could work together on this); Bruschetta; prosciutto-wrapped
 medium-cooked asparagus; Italian bread and olive oil.
- **Entrees** such as meat or vegetarian lasagna; Chicken Cacciatore or Tetrazzini; spaghetti with meatballs; Eggplant Parmesan; Shrimp Fettuccine Alfredo; baked Italian sausage and penne.
- **Sides** such as grilled vegetables; traditional Italian salad—greens, shaved Parmesan, artichoke hearts, etc.; spinach salad with bacon dressing; Caprese salad.
- **Desserts** such as tiramisu; gelato; cannoli; Panettone.
- Beverages such Italian white or red wine; sparkling Italian beverages; non-alcoholic beverages.

Seating is limited to 30, and we expect this event to be well-attended. The deadline to RSVP is November 10 or when 30 people have signed up, even if that is before November 10.





AAUW Priorities for the 116th Congress

AAUW's 2019-2021 Public Policy states that AAUW is committed to achieving "economic security for all women;... pay equity and fairness in compensation and benefits; and equitable access and advancement in employment, free from systemic barriers and biases, including vigorous enforcement of employment and discrimination statutes."

As a result of its policy positions, AAUW will urge Congress to pass the following:





- Pay Equity for All Act. This would ban employers from using salary history to determine future pay.
- Raise Wage Act. This would gradually increase the minimum wage to \$15 per hour.
- **FAMILY Act.** This would create a national paid family and medical leave insurance program for all workers.
- **Healthy Families Act.** This would eliminate the decision workers face between caring for their health and keeping their paycheck or job by having paid sick days.
- **BE HEARD in the Workplace Act.** This would address workplace harassment, including sexual harassment, and ensure workplaces are free from discrimination.
- **Gender Equity in Education Act.** Not only is women's economic security a top issue, but also the issue of equal access to education. This legislation would defend and strengthen Title IX.
