Branch Wins Three Stars from AAUW

Issues important to AAUW's mission to advance equity for women and girls were included in the bipartisan Building Blocks of STEM Act.

Members of the AAUW Capitol Hill

Lobby Corps lobbied for the bill in April, 2019. After approval by the House and the Senate, the bill was signed into law on December 24, 2019.

AAUW's **Public Policy Priorities** support a strong

system of public education that promotes gender fairness, equity, and diversity. This includes the promotion of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education.

The new law directs the National Science Foundation to award research grants to young girls in STEM activities, thus encouraging participation of girls in pre-K and elementary classrooms in math and science.

According to AAUW CEO Kim Churches, "This is a major step forward toward our collective goal of breaking down barriers for women and girls in STEM."

CHANGE IS INEVITABLE ... AND IT CAN BE GREAT

So many things have changed at AAUW recently. Have you seen the new website yet? Go online and browse a bit.

Another change will be how dues payments will be handled next year.

- Paying online is still the preferred way of taking care of payment for membership dues, BUT AAUW
 wants members to pay dues only in response to a personalized invoice that I will email you in May with
 the subject line "AAUW Membership Renewal."
- From that invoice, you will be able to click on a link to pay online, even if you have never created an account on AAUW.org.
- If you want to pay dues by check, send your check for the amount of the invoice to me made out to AAUW Vienna Area Branch.

This change will solve the confusion some members have had on how to handle payment for national, state, and branch dues on the website platform. It also automates a receipt for your payment, which will save time and money for staff and branch Finance Officers.

All you need to do is look for the emailed invoice in your inbox at the beginning of May. (If you have not received the invoice email with your invoice by the end of the second week of May, please call me.) Reminder: AAUW membership dues must be paid by July 1, the start of FY 2020-21.
