Voter Engagement

Public Policy: Enact the Equal Rights Amendment



We recently celebrated the 100th anniversary of the 19th Constitutional Amendment, which extended the right to vote to women. However, AAUW's gender-equity policy priorities ask us to fight for the Equal Rights Amendment

(ERA), which would guarantee women the same rights as men under the Constitution.

This amendment was first introduced in 1923, and by

1977, 35 states had ratified the ERA—but then progress halted until the required 38 states passed it. Virginia became the 38th state to ratify in 2020.

Alas, it stalled again because of a questionable deadline for ratification. By passing S.J. Resolution 1, the constitutional amendment process will move forward and the ERA will become the 28th Amendment.
