We aren't quite back to pre-pandemic operations yet. Our next three meetings are planned to be in person but our watchword continues to be "safety." That means following public health guidelines and the rules of the venues where we

meet. Masks and social distancing, even if not required, are encouraged. Please remember we are not only protecting ourselves but also our fellow members.

Looking to the future, your board is discussing our branch finances, both expenses and income. In recent years our budget has not accurately reflected expenses. We have tapped our cash reserves—which we are fortunate to have—and sometimes members have used personal funds to cover a branch expense. I'm grateful for the generosity of these members, but I feel strongly that the branch needs to pay its own way. We are also discussing if there are activities we would like to do if we had more funds.

On the income side, a recent survey shows our branch dues (\$10/year) are the lowest in AAUW-VA's Northern District. That alone does not warrant raising them, but it does indicate that if we need to increase revenue, a dues increase would not be out of line. We also have a cash reserve that is larger than is necessary for prudent operations. A crucial question is, what the best balance is between spending down some of the reserve and gradually raising dues?

I'd be glad to hear your input on this discussion.

Get Out The Vote

Denise Murden, AAUW-VA Co-VP for Public Policy, thanked volunteers from 18 branches who sent out 1,500 cards in the postcard-writing campaign for "Reclaim Our Vote."

AAUW-VA also supported the League of Women Voters of the Fairfax Area (LWVFA) on National Voter Registration Day, September 28. Sixty-one volunteers in 21 different libraries in Fairfax County conversed with voters and collected voter registration forms; handed out bilingual flyers, *Facts for Voters;* and issued *What's on the Ballot*?, a handout prepared by the LWVFA.

Legislative Priorities

AAUW-VA is an official co-sponsor of the LWVFA Candidate Forums for the upcoming election season. **This link** takes you to the Virginia House of Delegates Candidates Forums page. Registrants submitted questions for the delegates on Paid Sick Days/Paid Family and Medical Leave, the Gender Pay Gap, and sexual harassment in the workplace. Susan Burk, AAUW-VA Co-VP for Public Policy, has scheduled meetings with Virginia Senators to discuss paid sick days and paid family and medical leave.

AAUW-VA joined other state-wide organizations in signing a letter to the entire Virginia federal delegation to urge them to support the **Build Back Better** plan. The proposal would create 359,577 new jobs, raise wages for people who work in the care sectors, and generate additional income for Virginia families.

CEDAW

LWVFA reached out to AAUW-VA to support a resolution for the Fairfax Board of Supervisors to endorse the UN's Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW). Members

are participating in a group to draft a Fairfax resolution and also are working on a similar initiative for Alexandria.
