

Ambassador Cynthia Akeutteh recently retired from an illustrious career with the State Department, primarily in Africa.



Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion: Creating Inclusive Spaces

An atmosphere in which branch members feel valued and respected is a key component of having an inclusive branch.

This topic was discussed by three distinguished panelists at the AAUW-VA online seminar on January 22, 2022: **Somya Dwivedi-Burks, Krysta Jones**, and **Jonathon Zur**. All three are based in Virginia, and Krysta is a member of the Arlington Branch.

They offered practical suggestions on ways to make members feel respected and valued. To create an inclusive space requires both an action plan and an



intentional, sustained practice. In particular, members must be open to receiving feedback and know when to speak up and when to listen.

We must work to ensure DE&I is embedded in our branch culture. We all have bias, but we must be willing to call ourselves out. Being able to get out of our comfort zones and to identify specific actions and behaviors may lead to membership retention.

Public Policy Matters

AAUW strongly supports an excellent public education for all children and opposes the use of publicly funded vouchers or publicly funded private schools for a few. Without well-funded public schools, Virginia will never close the education achievement gap.

Since Lobby Corps is not meeting in person, lobbying by members continues in emails, letters, and phone calls to Virginia lawmakers to oppose legislation that would divert public funds to private schools and home schooling. AAUW is committed to open and fair elections that are broadly accessible to all voters; to nonpartisan voter education efforts that promote equitable political participation and representation in appointed and elected offices; and to expanding voting rights.

Members are urged to contact their Congressional lawmakers to support the Freedom to Vote Act and the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act (H.R.4). The latter has passed in House of Representatives but not in the Senate.

AAUW Dues Increase

For fiscal year 2023, which begins July 1, 2022, the AAUW national dues will be \$67, of which \$64 will be taxdeductible. Our branch dues will not change from the current \$10 annual rate.






