Annual Collection to Help Women-In-Need

For well over 30 years, our branch has annually supported residents of Artemis House (operated by Shelter House, Inc.) as our project to benefit women-in-need in our community and their children. With two locations, Artemis House is the only Fairfax County-sponsored 24-



emergency shelter for women and children fleeing domestic and sexual violence and human trafficking.

branch collects donations of store (not credit-card) gift cards and full-size personal care items that are given to the residents who generally arrive

only with the cloths they are wearing. Gift cards from grocery, drug stores, and multi-purpose stores like Walmart and Target are the most useful for purchasing everything from medicine to diapers/toys/cloths. Donations of full-size adult or child/baby hand/body/face lotion, shampoo, and body wash and other personal care items are appreciated. Your donation is a tax-deductible donation to "Shelter House, Inc." In compliance with IRS policies, we do not collect cash donations for another non-profit.

As Artemis House Chair, I am collecting gift card and personal care item donations from now through the annual December Holiday Lunch Event at noon on December 9th at Pazzo Pomodoro at Danor Plaza, 118 Branch Rd, SE, Vienna.
