Membership and Dues

Is It Time to Renew Your Membership? It Depends.

By June 15, many of you – but not all – will receive reminders to renew your AAUW membership for the new fiscal year starting July 1. Expiration dates for our members range this year from June 30, 2024, to February 28, 2025, depending on when they joined. The reminder from AAUW will arrive before your membership expiration date, so there is no need to renew until you receive an email reminder. However, renewing as soon as you receive a reminder will make the renewal process easier for your officers.

How much are the dues?

Dues for most of you are again \$97, which covers the following:

- Vienna Area Branch, \$10
- Virginia state, \$15
- AAUW national, \$72.

Life members pay only branch and state dues. Remember that the national dues are entirely tax-deductible if you itemize your deductions in 2025.

To renew online with a credit card.

Many of you use this method successfully to renew. If you have never tried, or if you tried and quit, I would be glad to try to help. I can send you a PDF file with screen shots and step-by-step instructions. We can go through the steps together on the telephone, and I can answer your questions as we go. 
