The Institute is a professional education program developed by Virginia Women Leading Government and academic partners to provide connections, content, tools, and opportunities for women aspiring to become local government leaders. Ms. Svrcek served as the Deputy City Manager, and then City Manager for the City of Lynchburg for a combined term of more than twenty years. She also worked for the Town of Blacksburg, Fairfax County, and the City of Los Angeles’ Washington, DC office. Hear her describe her own professional journey – the one that led to the establishment of the Institute; and, hear her share how the institute is performing in its mission to educate and empower women to pursue advancement in municipal leadership.
